

# Glossary

### **Derived FTE Workers**

Estimate of the number of Full Time Equivalent (FTE) workers, based on the average hourly wage for the Rate Group and Insurable Earnings, for the previous calendar year based on the March snapshot of the current year. It assumes a person works 2,000 hours per year.

### **Derived Hours Worked**

An estimate of the number of hours worked based on the average hourly wage for the Rate Group and Insurable Earnings for a year.

# **Fatality Claim**

Allowed claims for workers who died of a work-related disease, condition or traumatic incident.

## Lost Time Injury Claim

A "lost time" injury/illness claim is where a worker suffers a work-related injury/disease which results in being off work past the day of incident, loss of wages/earnings or a permanent disability/impairment. This count also includes fatal claims.

### **Lost Time Injury Frequency**

The number of allowed lost-time injury and illness claims per 200,000 derived employee hours for the injury year specified.

### No Lost Time Injury Claim

A "no lost time" claim results from a work-related injury/Illness where no time is lost from work, other than on the day of incident, but where health care is required. The health care costs resulting from the injury are paid by the WSIB.

#### **No Lost Time Injury Frequency**

The number of allowed no lost-time injury and illness claims per 200,000 derived employee hours for the injury year specified.

#### **Number of Injuries YTD**

Injuries allowed YTD based on the injury date or, for occupational diseases, the date the impairment started as confirmed by a medical practitioner.

## **Total Injuries**

Allowed no lost time and lost time injuries.

## **Traumatic Fatal Injury Claim**

Allowed claims for workers who died of a work-related traumatic injury.

#### **Traumatic Fatal Frequency**

The number of allowed traumatic injury claims per 200,000 derived employee hours for the injury year specified.

**Note**: Figures in this report should not be compared with figures in reports prepared prior to 2014 as definitions used to compile the report changed in 2014. All data presented is extracted from WSIB's Enterprise Information Warehouse and is to be used for comparison purposes only as year-to-date data is not mature.
